



Rocky Boy's Detention Center Opens

OFMC will supply Operations & Maintenance (O&M) funding for part of the new Chippewa-Cree Tribal Justice Center which opened in May on the Rocky Boy's Reservation in Montana. The facility, which houses the tribe's public safety, detention and corrections programs, was constructed by the tribally owned Chippewa Cree Construction Company with funding from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ).

The facility is one of 25 newly constructed detention centers across Indian Country funded by DOJ that will need O&M funding. OFMC will fund O&M for almost 10,000 square feet of its detention space.

OFMC already provides O&M for 50 Office of Justice Services detention centers.
