

Access to Capital Clearinghouse

Launched during the 2023 White House Tribal Nations Summit, in alignment with Executive Order 14112 Reforming Federal Funding and Support for Tribal Nations, the Clearinghouse represents the Biden-Harris Administration's commitment to an all-of-government approach in meeting treaty and trust obligations by **creating a single source** for Tribes to reference when researching federal funding opportunities to meet their needs in the pursuit of self-governance.

The [Clearinghouse](#) is meant to serve those working in and for Indian Country. Categorically speaking this includes Native entrepreneurs, Tribal employees working in various departments and capacities, Tribal Governments, Native CDFIs, and Tribal consortiums. It's also a great reference for federal employees that are providing technical assistance and assisting Tribes in researching available funding programs and projects.

Currently, the Clearinghouse hosts federal funding opportunities from agencies across the Federal government. With various categories of funding, the Clearinghouse hosts a diversity of grants, loans, loan guarantees, tax credits, cost sharing, technical assistance, vouchers, and more.

Request for Information

The White House Council on Native American Affairs (WHCNA) Committee on Economic Development, Energy, and Infrastructure is issuing a draft voluntary Request for Information (RFI) for Tribal consultation to develop a baseline understanding of Tribal funding needs to improve federal budget formulation and requests, program and policy development, and resource deployment. This RFI, once final, will help establish baseline funding needs for Tribal governments, which has never been done by the federal government.
