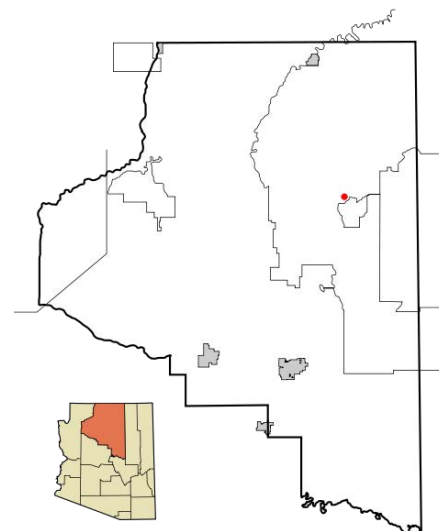

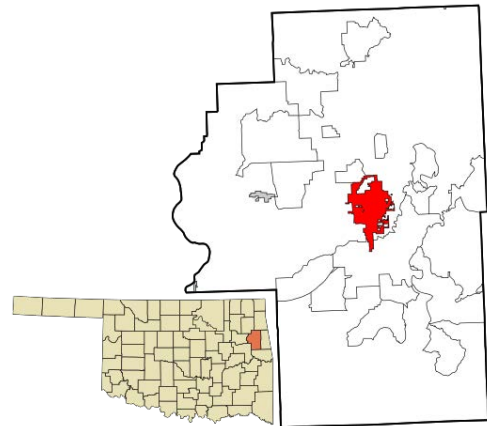
CHEROKEE NATION RURAL BUSINESS INCUBATOR (CNRBI)

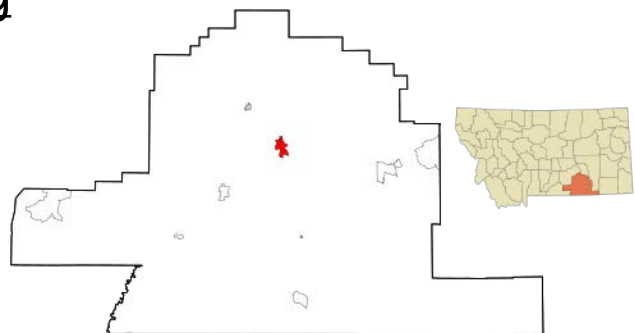
CROW NATION INNOVATION CENTER

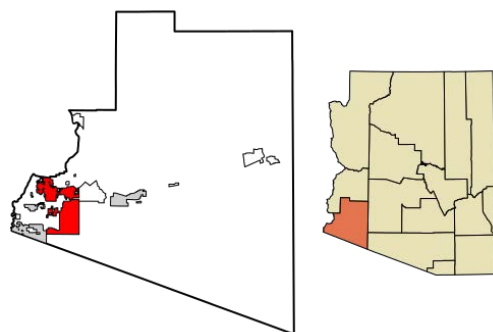
QUECHAN INDIAN TRIBE BUSINESS INCUBATOR

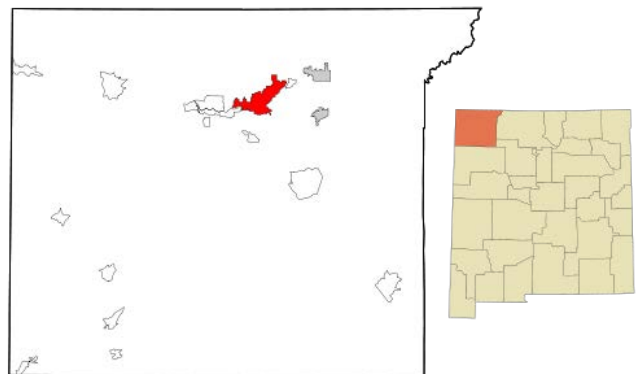


AMERICAN INDIAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (AIBE)

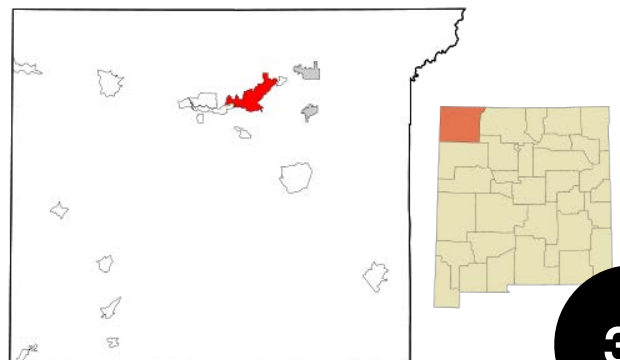
OYATE KIN TO WOWASH UN WASHAG UN YAPI STRENGTHEN THE PEOPLE ECONOMICALLY

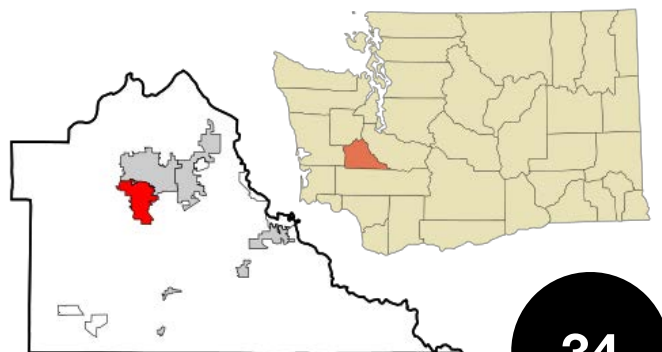
INTERTRIBAL BUSINESS INCUBATOR (IBI)

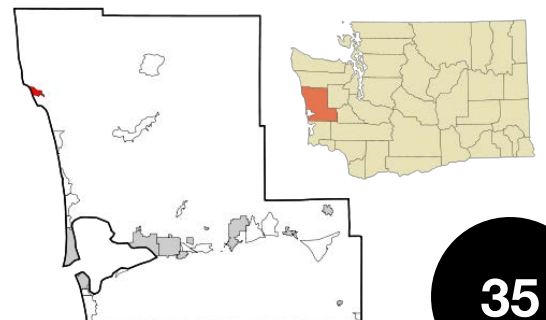
CEDAR ROOT BUSINESS CENTER






